New section added: Do not give a positive HIV positive result on a Friday

New section added: Use destigmatising language when discussing HIV. Appendix 1 has preferred language suggestions.

New section added: Investigate the counselling services WA AIDS Council (WAAC) can provide the client.

New section added: The rapport between the clinician and client is key to HIV management

New section added: Contact tracing is an ongoing process, particularly when there is poor HIV control.

Aboriginal clients may require cultural support and currently there are limited appropriate resources.
